Mun resolution paper guide

There are 3 parts of the resolution paper you currently need

The heading

The pre ambulatory clauses

And the operative clauses.

The heading has 4 points. The committee name, the sponsors, the signatories and the topic

Resolution GA/3/1.1

General Assembly Third Committee

Sponsors: United States, Austria and Italy Signatories: Greece, Tajikistan, Japan, Canada, Mali, the Netherlands and Gabon Topic: "Strengthening UN coordination of humanitarian assistance in complex emergencies"

The sponsors are the people writing the resolution, so just you in this case.

The signatories are the people who support your paper, which is only relevant if you write it on site, which you aren't, so just leave it blank

The pre ambulatory clauses are written in a weird way, so it might be a bit confusing. They are basically the problems your country has with the topic.

Sample Preambulatory Phrases

Affirming Expecting Having studied Alarmed by Expressing its appreciation Keeping in mind Approving Expressing its satisfaction Noting with deep Aware of Fulfilling Noting with regret Noting with deep concern Bearing in mind Fully alarmed Noting with satisfaction Noting further Believing Fully aware Confident Fully believing Noting with approval Contemplating Further deploring

You start each issue with one of these words. And to make sense of what you're saying, imagine the name of your country before each issue (but don't actually write it down that would be dumb)

End each of your issues with a comma instead of a period.

Ex:

The General Assembly,

<u>Reminding</u> all nations of the celebration of the 50th anniversary of the <u>Universal Declaration of Human Rights</u>, which recognizes the inherent dignity, equality and inalienable rights of all global citizens, [use commas to separate preambulatory clauses]

Reaffirming its Resolution 33/1996 of 25 July 1996, which encourages Governments to work with UN bodies aimed at improving the coordination and effectiveness of humanitarian assistance,

Noting with satisfaction the past efforts of various relevant UN bodies and nongovernmental organizations,

<u>Stressing</u> the fact that the United Nations faces significant financial obstacles and is in need of reform, particularly in the humanitarian realm,

Underline the words you got from the list

Operative clauses are your countries resolutions to these issues. They are written the same way as pre ambulatory clauses.

Sample Operative Phrases

These are the words you use at the start of every resolution. Also you end each of your reolutions wit ha semi colon and the last one with a period. (also try to make the font times new roman and the size 11 for formality reasons.) (also use the fanciest words you know. Open a thesaurus, so bottom line, try to sound official and fancy)

Ex:

- Encourages all relevant agencies of the United Nations to collaborate more closely with countries at the grassroots level to enhance the carrying out of relief efforts; [use semicolons to separate operative clauses]
- Urges member states to comply with the goals of the UN Department of Humanitarian Affairs to streamline efforts of humanitarian aid;
- 3. <u>Requests</u> that all nations develop rapid deployment forces to better enhance the coordination of relief efforts of humanitarian assistance in complex emergencies;
- 4. <u>Calls</u> for the development of a United Nations Trust Fund that encourages voluntary donations from the private transnational sector to aid in funding the implementation of rapid deployment forces;
- 5. <u>Stresses</u> the continuing need for impartial and objective information on the political, economic and social situations and events of all countries;
- 6. <u>Calls</u> upon states to respond quickly and generously to consolidated appeals for humanitarian assistance; and
- 7. <u>Requests</u> the expansion of preventive actions and assurance of post-conflict assistance through reconstruction and development. **[end resolutions with a period]**

The rest of the paper is written during the conference so this is the only relevant part for you.
